Special Admission Contest for International Students

University of the Azores

2024-2025

In accordance with Decree-Law No. 62/2018, of August 6th, which amends and republishes the international student statute, published by Decree-Law No. 36/2014, of March 10th amended by Decree-Law no. 113/2014, of July 16th, and the Regulation of the Special Contest for Access and Admission of International Students to the University of the Azores, approved by Order No. 1137/2015, of January 20, amended by Order No. 2301/2022, of February 3rd, the University of the Azores opens the special competition for access and entrance of international students in undergraduate and integrated masters courses for the academic year 2024-2025.

1. Who may apply

The Special Admission Contest for International Students is meant for applicants who:

- a) do not have Portuguese nationality.
- b) are not nationals from a member state of the European Union.
- c) are not family members of Portuguese or of nationals of a member state of the European Union, regardless of their nationality.
- d) do not legally reside in Portugal, until the 1st of January of 2024, for more than two continuously years, and are not family of foreign citizens that hold a resident permit for more than two years.
- e) are not beneficiaries, on the 1st of January of 2024, of the status of equal rights and duties attributed under the international treaty granted between the Portuguese State and the State of which they are nationals.
- f) are not enrolled in a Portuguese university under a mobility program.
- g) are not applying to higher education through the special regimes regulated by Decree-Law 393-A/99, of October 2, amended by Decree-Law 272/2009, of October 1, and by Decree-Law No. 11/2020, of April 2, namely:
 - i. Scholarship students from Portuguese-speaking African countries, within the framework of cooperation agreements signed by the Portuguese State.
 - ii. Foreign employees of diplomatic missions accredited in Portugal and their relatives residing here, in a regime of reciprocity.
 - iii. Naturals and sons of natives of the territory of Timor-Leste.
- h) Do not have, at the time of application, more than one nationality, one of which is Portuguese or that of another member state of the European Union.

2. Entry requirements and admission conditions

2.1. The University of the Azores accepts applications to its undergraduate programs/ integrated masters from non-European citizens who:

- a) hold a qualification giving access to Higher Education, meaning any diploma or certificate issued by a competent authority in the country in which it was awarded attesting the approval in a study programme giving direct access to higher education in the country where it was awarded.
- or
- b) hold a Portuguese secondary school diploma or equivalent qualification (for recognition see).

2.2. Additionally, applicants must check the following 1), 2) and 3) cumulative conditions:

- a) have **specific academic qualifications in the areas of knowledge required for the cycle of studies they are applying for**, that is, have admission exams carried out in the calendar year or in the three calendar years prior to the application, which may be one of the following:
 - i. admission exams established for the cycle of studies in question within the scope of the general access and admission regime (National Access Competition);
 - ii. homologous courses of the admission exams¹;
 - iii. admission exams to foreign higher education recognized by the University of the Azores (ENEM, Vestibular, Gaokao, Unified Access Exam, Ser Bachiller, State Exam) or who have completed the International Baccalaureate - Diploma Program (DP);
 - iv. written exam(s) held at the University of the Azores, in the language in which the study cycle is taught, and incident on the subjects of the entrance exams established for the study cycle in question within the scope of the general access and admission regime;
- b) have a level of knowledge of Portuguese equivalent to level B2 according to the Common European Framework of Reference for Languages (CEFR);
- c) meet the prerequisites established for each study cycle in the National Access Competition.

3. Vacancies

The opening of the 2nd and 3rd phases depends on the existence of vacancies left over from the previous phase.

4.2. Applications must be submitted online at <https://inforestudante.uac.pt/>

4.3. Application requires the following documents:

- a) copy of identification card/passport, that clearly indicates the nationality of the applicant.
- b) honour statement that the applicant does not have Portuguese nationality nor is covered by the Decree-Law 62/2018, of August 6 (no. 2 and 3).
- c) Portuguese Secondary School diploma or equivalent foreign qualification, with final classification, duly validated by the competent authorities.
- d) candidates who have a foreign academic qualification that grants access to higher education in the country in which it was obtained, not covered by the previous paragraph, must attach the document proving that qualification to the application.
- e) for the application to the cycle of studies with access prerequisites, a document attesting that the candidate holds them.

4.4. Depending on each case, candidates must also attach to their application form a document proving that they have a **specific academic qualification for access to the cycle of studies**, applicable in each situation, duly validated by the authorities:

- a) Applicants who have completed admission exams for higher education acknowledged by the University of the Azores (ENEM, Vestibular, Gaokao, Exame Unificado de Acesso, Ser Bachiller, Examen de Estado and International Baccalaureate) must attach a document proving their final score(s);
- b) Applicants who have successfully completed admission exams for higher education in Portugal as self-proposed must attach a document proving their final score(s);
- c) Applicants who have approved courses taken abroad considered homologous² to the Portuguese admission exams required for the cycle of studies they are applying to must attach a document proving their final score(s) and contents in the course(s), unless the applicable law, at the application's date, provides for the dismissal of such document:
- d) Applicants who have taken and passed the written exam(s) held at the University of the Azores must attach to their application form a document proving their approval in the same(s).

4.5. Applicants who do not hold a Portuguese secondary education diploma or who do not have a qualification obtained in Portuguese-speaking countries must present documentary evidence that they have a degree of knowledge of Portuguese equivalent to level B2, according to the CEFR.

4.6. All documents proving qualifications obtained abroad must be authenticated by the official education services of the respective country and recognized by the Portuguese diplomatic or consular authority, or bring the Apostille of the Hague Convention, and the same must happen in relation to the translations of documents whose original language not Spanish, French, or English.

4.7. Documents proving qualifications obtained abroad that have not been issued in Portuguese, Spanish, French or English must be translated into Portuguese or English by a translator recognized by the Portuguese diplomatic representation and authenticated.

4.8. Applicants who wish to benefit from the student in emergency situations for humanitarian reasons status must provide documentation proving that they are in the referred situation, issued by the Borders Service and by the United Nations High Commissioner for Refugees or by the International Organization for Migrations.

5. Tuitions and Fees

5.1. Application fee is 50€ (non-refundable).

5.2. Applicants living in Portugal may pay through ATM or at the treasury services at the University of the Azores in Ponta Delgada or Angra do Heroísmo. Applicants living abroad may pay by credit card (<https://pagamentos.redunig.pt/payments/3042992/universidadedosacores/1/redirect/form>), safely and without additional costs.

5.3. Only applications paid within the established deadline will be considered.

5.4. Under no circumstances will the application and registration and enrolment fees be refunded, and in case of cancellation of registration and enrolment the provisions of article 8 of the University of the Azores Tuition Regulations will be applied.

5.5. The value of the tuition fees will be published on the UAc website.

6. Admissions

6.1. The University of the Azores verifies the admissions and may request original documents or copies duly authenticated and additional information when necessary.

6.2. The Academic Services of the University of the Azores will refuse applications not duly completed or still lacking requested documentation.

6.3. Applicants will be ranked according to the following criteria:

a) Secondary School or legally equivalent qualification final grade – 50%.

b) Final grades obtained in the admission exam(s) required for each study cycle, or in homologous courses of the admission exams, or in the written exam(s) held at the University of the Azores – 50%.

6.4. For applicants from Brazil who have completed the National Exam for Higher Education (ENEM), the criteria referred to in b), number 6.3., is described in Annex 1 – ENEM Brazil.

6.5. For applicants from China who have completed the National Exam for Higher Education Gaokao, the criteria referred in b), number 6.3., is described in Annex 2 – Gaokao (China).

6.6. For applicants from Macao who have completed the Exame Unificado de Acesso exam from Macao, the criteria referred in b), number 6.3., is described in Annex 3 – Exame Unificado de Acesso (Macao).

6.7. For applicants from Ecuador who have completed the National Exam for Higher Education Ser Bachiller, the criteria referred in b), number 6.3., is described in Annex 4 – Ser Bachiller (Ecuador).

6.8. For applicants from Colombia who have completed the National Exam for Higher Education Examen de Estado, the criteria referred in b), number 6.3., is described in Annex 5 – Examen de Estado (Colombia).

6.9. For applicants who have completed the International Baccalaureate (Diploma Program - DP), the criteria referred to in b), number 6.3, is described in Annex 6 - International Baccalaureate (Diploma Program - DP).

6.10. If the number of admitted students in one of the study cycle's is lower than the number of vacancies, the admitted students will be presented by alphabetical order.

7. Written exams (candidates under point iv. of point a) of point 2.2.)

7.1. The timetable for the written exams held at the University of the Azores will be published in due time on the University of the Azores website.

7.2. Places where the written exams will be held: the written exams will be held in person at the premises of the University of the Azores.

8. Prerequisites

The verification of the satisfaction of the prerequisites is carried out in the manner required of other students, namely within the scope of the general access and admission regime.

The following prerequisites are required for the study cycles of:

- Civil Protection and Risk Management - Grupo D - Capacidade de visão
- Communication and Public Relations - Grupo B - Comunicação interpessoal
- Education - Grupo B - Comunicação interpessoal
- History - Grupo B - Comunicação interpessoal
- Nursing (Angra do Heroísmo) - Grupo A - Comunicação interpessoal
- Nursing (Ponta Delgada) - Grupo A - Comunicação interpessoal
- Portuguese and English Studies - Grupo B - Comunicação interpessoal

9. Disclosure of results

9.1. The lists with the application's results are published on the website of the University of the Azores, within the deadlines indicated in 4.1.

9.2. Complaints must be submitted using a specific form available at <https://inforestudante.uac.pt/>, within 10 working days after the results of each phase are announced.

10. Applicable law

We recommend reading Decree-Law 62/2018, of August 6 that regulates the International Student Status and the University of the Azores' Regulation on the special admission contest for international students, altered by Order No. 2301/2022, of February 3rd.

Annex 1 – ENEM (Brazil)

1. The University of the Azores accepts applications to the Special Admission Contest of International Students from Brazil who have successfully completed the National Exam for Higher Education (ENEM) of the last three years.

2. For ranking purposes, a **Final Exam Grade (FEG)** will be calculated in the Brazilian grading system (ranging from 0 to 1000), according to the following formula:

$$\text{FEG} = (\text{P1} \times \text{HSTG}) + (\text{P2} \times \text{NSTG}) + (\text{P3} \times \text{LCTG}) + (\text{P4} \times \text{MTG}) + (\text{P5} \times \text{WG}) + (\text{P6} \times \text{EnemGrade})$$

in which:

- a) HSTG, NSTG, LCTG, MTG and WG are the final scores obtained in each exam, according to Chart 1;

2. For ranking purposes, a Final Exam Grade (FEG) will be calculated in the Colombian grading system (ranging from 0 to 500), according to the following formula:

$$FEG = (P1 \times CR) + (P2 \times MAT) + (P3 \times SC) + (P4 \times NS) + (P5 \times ENG) + (P6 \times AEXEST)$$

in which:

a) CR, MAT, SC, NS and ENG are the final grades obtained in each exam, according to Chart 1;

4. The minimum admission score in the Final Exam Grade (FEG) required at the University of the Azores is 100 in the Portuguese grading system.

Annex 6 – International Baccalaureate (Diploma Programme- DP)

1. The University of the Azores accepts applications to the Special Admission Contest of International Students who have successfully completed the International Baccalaureate (Diploma Programme- DP) in the last three years.

2. For ranking purposes, a Final Exam Grade (FEG) will be calculated in the original grading system (ranging from 0 to 7), according to the following formula:

$$FEG = (P1 \times Group1) + (P2 \times Group2) + (P3 \times Group3) + (P4 \times Group4) + (P5 \times Group5) + (P6 \times Group6)$$

in which:
