Call for Applications for the Master's Degree in Island and Atlantic History (15th–20th centuries)

Under the terms of Article 17 of the General Regulations for Master's Degrees of the University of the Azores, it is hereby announced that applications are open for the Master's Degree in Island and Atlantic History (15th–20th centuries), at the Ponta Delgada campus.

1. Vacancies

1.1. Number of vacancies:

a) National or equivalent applicants: 12

b) International applicants: 3

1.2. Vacancies for the 2nd phase: remaining vacancies from previous phase.

1.3. Use of vacancies: Unfilled vacancies in one category may be transferred to another after the end of the respective application phase and subject to a favorable opinion from the Course Director.

Note 1: A national or equivalent applicant is one who does not fall under the definition of an international student as provided in Article 3 of Decree-Law No. 62/2018 of August 6.

2. Access Conditions

2.1. Eligible applicants for the master's degree:

a) Holders of a bachelor's degree, or a legally equivalent qualification, in History and related fields;

b) Holders of a foreign higher academic degree in History and related fields, or legally equivalent qualifications, awarded following a 1st cycle of studies organised in accordance with the principles of the Bologna Process by a State adhering to this Process;

c) Holders of a foreign higher academic degree in History and related fields, or legally equivalent qualifications, recognised as meeting the objectives of a bachelor's degree by the Scientific Council;

d) Holders of an academic, scientific or professional curriculum recognised by the Scientific Council as attesting the capacity to undertake the master's programme.

2.2. The recognition referred to in points b) to d) of paragraph 2.1 only grants access to the master's degree programme and does not confer on its holder the equivalence to a bachelor's degree or the recognition of that degree.

3. Application Submission

3.2. Applications must be submitted exclusively electronically via the link available at <https://inforestudante.uac.pt/nonio/security/login.do>, and must include the following documents:

a) Application form;

- b) Identification document (foreign applicants only);
- c) Motivation letter;
- d) *Detailed curriculum vitae (that allows for an assessment of merit or preference);*
- e) Certificates for all qualifications, indicating the grades obtained in each subject and the final course average;
- f) Supporting documents.

Note 3: Whenever the aforementioned documents are in a foreign language other than Spanish, French, or English, a translation into Portuguese by a translator recognized by the Portuguese diplomatic representation must be submitted.

3.3. Uploading documents and supporting documents electronically is mandatory and does not exempt the delivery of the original or duly authenticated documents to the Academic Management Service whenever the Academic Management Service deems it necessary.

3.4. All documents proving qualifications obtained abroad must be authenticated by the official education services of the respective country and contain the Apostille of the Hague Convention, the same applying to translations of documents whose original language is not Spanish, French, or English.

4. Application Fee and Tuition

4.1. The application fee is €70 (non-refundable). This payment must be made via ATM (payment details will be generated after the application is sealed) or at the University of the Azores treasuries in Ponta Delgada or Angra do Heroísmo.

Note 4: Only applications for which payment has been made within the application deadline will be considered valid.

4.2. Candidates who demonstrably reside abroad must make the payment within the deadline by bank transfer or [credit card](#). Proof of payment must be attached to the application form or sent to queroestudar@uac.pt.

4.3. Enrolment and registration in the programme require the payment of tuition fees in the amount of €1,180 (one thousand one hundred and eighty euros) for national students or equivalent, and €2,500 (two thousand five hundred euros) for international students.

5. Admission and ranking

5.1. Candidates will be ranked based on the application of the following criteria:

- a) Academic curriculum, in particular the areas and classifications of undergraduate degrees and other higher academic degrees (50%);
- b) Scientific curriculum, in particular research experience and publications (20%);
- c) Professional experience (30%).

5.2. The evaluation of the candidates' curriculum and professional experience will be carried out based on the criteria contained in the attached grid (Annex I).

5.3. Whenever the number of applications is equal to or less than the total number of vacancies, and once the entry requirements have been verified, the candidates will not be ranked, and for the purpose of publishing the results, they will be presented in alphabetical order.

6. Announcement of results

6.1. The results of the applications are published on the University of the Azores' website.

6.2. Appeals may be submitted during the prior hearing periods indicated in the calendars for each application phase, by submitting a request for appeal against the application result at <https://infoestudante.uac.pt>.

6.3. The results of the appeals are published on the University of the Azores' website.

7. Registrations and enrollments

Registration and enrollment take place on the website infoestudante.uac.pt within the deadlines defined in point 3. Students who are not enrolled and registered are not allowed to attend classes.

8. Start of course

The course will only run if a minimum number of students enroll.
